

# EVENTS REPORT BPAC AGM 2024

#### 1. Tournament Calendar 2023

**25 International tournaments** (BWF Grade 3) were sanctioned by **15 Members** besides the **3 Continental Tournaments** for a total of **28 tournaments** (40% more than 2022) taking part in the calendar for the year **2023.** 

This increase of the number of tournaments, is due to the Olympic Qualification Period (OQP) and the **Santiago Pan American GAMES 2023**, so this calendar will provide enough participation towards reach a better position in the BWF WR and in addition could be seeded into the draws for **Pan Am Games 2023**.

Nevertheless, some of the hosts had to cancel their tournaments, due to internal challenges that they couldn't be overcome. (17% in comparison to 2022 that was 25%)

Is important to **highlight** that **Mexico** host **4** of the 5 (including the Pan American Cup 2023) tournaments that they apply for 2023, being the Member that host more tournaments in 2023, followed by Peru (including the Pan Am Junior 2023) and Guatemala which hosted **4** tournaments.


#### c. Referees and Umpires appraisal program

## ii. Umpire Accreditation and Certification Assessment



#### 4.2. National Technical Officials Training

#### 4.2.1. Line Judges Training SANTIAGO 2023

Line Judges training was delivered in two stages in collaboration with **Santiago 2023 LOC** and CHI BA.

The 1<sup>st</sup> stage took place at the end of March before a national tournament, so CHI BA together with Games LOC promote the training course for all people interested.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> stage of the training was done during the **Chile International 2023** which also was the final evaluation for candidates.

Over **40** national Line judges were trained most of them from the city of Santiago.



### 4.2.2. French Guyana National TOs Training

Considering that FGU BAM sanction their very first international tournament (Future Series) a plan to support its implementation was implemented to train Umpires, Line Judges ant Desk officials, in this opportunity **Yves Cote** (TOs Assessor) from December 7<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> was in charge to deliver a training for all these roles before the tournament in which he officiated as a Referee.

This tournament also has the participation of international and national umpires from Suriname.

### 4.3. Tournament Software training 2023

Two Tournament Software workshops were held in 2023 as follows:

### 4.3.1. Suriname and Trinidad and Tobago

This TS workshop was delivered in 5 sessions with a length of 2 hours every two days, starting on April 18<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup>.

11 participants took part in in this course which was delivered by **PJ Williams** (BPAC Referee) who shares all his knowledge and experience to the panel.

#### 4.4. BWF Events Management Lv1

In this opportunity an **BWF Events Management course** was delivered for the second semester of the year 2023 after invitation made by BWF.

In accordance with them, an invitation was sent to 18 Member Associations (ARG, ARU, BAR, BRA, CAN, CHI, COL, DOM, ESA, GUA, GUF, JAM, MEX, PAR, PER, SUR, TTO, USA), in this case the MAs should nominates a maximum of 3 candidates including a women to take part of the first stage of the course which is the virtual course and according to their performance and the submission of a tournament project, BWF together with BPAC will define the candidates which will take part at the second stage this course which is the Face-to-Face course.

After the deadline for MAs candidates' nomination, only 7 MAs submitted forms for a total of 14 candidates for the first stage.


