

2.1 In Shuttle Time courses:

In 2016

- Two(2) Shuttle Time Teachers course were completed
- Thirty(30) Teachers were trained

There are plans to do six(6) shuttle Time teachers course and one tutors course in 2017

There are six(6) certified tutors in Jamaica. There are plans to utilize three additional tutors in the shuttle time teachers course in the near future .

2.2 Implementation of the program in schools:

Since inception of the program :

- over 3000 boys and girls have been introduced to shuttle time , approximately 1 500 boys and 1 500 girls.
- Some 80 schools have been introduced to shuttle time.

3. Achievements

- In March 2016 the JBA conducted a Prep/Primary championships where teachers from shuttle time programmes were invited to enter the tournament .
- The securing of sponsorship from NESTLE Healthy Kids

4. Difficulties

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The main difficulties experienced are as follows:

- The number of tutors available to conduct teachers course
- The cost of conducting each course .
- The availability of appropriate venues at affordable prices
- Non-availability of in-door courts. One solution is to utilize the outdoors .
- Non-availability of out-door shuttles.
